

National Conference on Responding to Missing and Unidentified Persons Annual Service Award

Nominations accepted through February 28, 2017.

The National Criminal Justice Training Center (NCJTC) of Fox Valley Technical College is accepting nominations for the Annual Missing and Unidentified Persons Conference Service Award. This award is presented to an individual who has taken extraordinary efforts in the area of missing and unidentified persons.

Purpose

This award recognizes the extraordinary efforts and outstanding achievement of an individual (including Federal, state, and local law enforcement, search and rescue, criminal justice, victim assistance, or other allied professionals who contribute to the location and return of missing persons) who:

- consistently demonstrates compassion, service, and commitment to missing and unidentified persons issues;
- has made a significant contribution to furthering the knowledge and experiences afforded to those charged with protecting our citizens;
- has been steadfast in their determination and leadership through collaboration, education, and training; and
- has been an innovator and catalyst for change in the field of law enforcement, search and recovery, and victim and survivor assistance.

Eligibility

- Nominee must be a current Federal, state, and local law enforcement, search and rescue, criminal justice, victim assistance, or other allied professional
- Nominee must have made a significant contribution to the field
- Nominations will not be accepted from relatives or friends; nor will self-nominations be accepted

Judging Criteria

- The degree to which the individual's services/actions have made a lasting or meaningful contribution or impact in the field
- The length and degree of the individual's service
- The extent to which the individual's service or action might be considered above and beyond the call of duty
- The extent to which the individual's action is recognized and valued by their peers/ community leaders
- The extent to which the individual has excelled in his/her position and demonstrated integrity and strong commitment to the mission and values of their profession

Nominations will be accepted through February 28, 2017. The MUPC Planning Committee will review all nominations and determine the recipient of the 2017 award. The winner will be notified by March 31, 2017. The award will be given at the 2017 MUPC Conference, held in Atlanta, GA on September 19-21, 2017.
