

- Secure the crime scene
- Secure witnesses
- Immediate deployment of resources
- Command and control interviews, interrogation, leads management, and debriefing


Natural Disasters

- Team approach




Management of the Incident

• In many incidents, the success or failure of the response can depend on how the incident is managed




Management of the Incident – Bottom Up

- Allows for expertise and insights of responders to be utilized
- "Boots on the ground"



Management of the Incident – Top Down

Helps ensure accountability



What is a CART?

- CART (Child Abduction Response Team) is a multidisciplinary team comprised of investigators and support personnel that can respond to a missing or abducted event
- Team members are trained in all aspects of responding to a missing or abducted child case
- CART can be comprised of several agencies
 - Memorandum of Understandings (MOU)

Time is the Enemy



Washington State Study

https://www.atg.wa.gov/child-abduction-murder-research

- 74-76 % murdered in the first 3 hours
- 58% mistakenly reported as "missing" not abducted
- 56% waited more than 2 hours to report "missing" child
- Unknown initial contact site solvability rate = 23.9%
- Known initial contact site solvability rate = 79.7%



CART and Incident Command System (ICS)

- ICS quickly establishes organization of the incident
- Uses a command structure to oversee operations
- Provides for accountability during the operation



Structure of the CART

- Can be diverse group
- May consist of a "Core Team"
- Brainstorm resources
- Members should be dedicated and team players
- Teams will need revitalized



Step One

Establishing the "core group" or steering committee

- Group members must have agency commitment
- Experience in police investigations and procedure
- Leadership responsibilities
- Knowledge and experience in child abductions, and/or child homicide investigations
- Knowledge of community resources

Core Group Skills

- Search and rescue
- Analyzing data
- Ability to develop and implement protocols, policies and procedures
- Experience in Incident Command System (ICS) and/or command structure
- Experience in high impact, large scale events
- Liaison from each participating agency
- Ability to make things happen



Core Group Responsibilities

- Divide resources to fit within the ICS model
- Identify resources needed for search, rescue, investigation and prosecution
- Create the team composition
- Identify individual assignments



Explore Resources



- Lack of experience should not equate to lack of preparation
- Practice utilizing scenario activities and mock call outs

Policy / Procedures / MOU's

- Must remain up-to-date and ready to go
- Guide for incoming and new members
- Keeps things uniform and consistent
- MOU's with all participating agencies





CART in Action

- Murray, Utah
 - 11 year old, chronic runaway in need of medication
 - Gone for 1 day
 - Witness stated that the child was in the company of a homeless woman, who was also known to be a prostitute
- Utah CART intel and logistics activated
- Missing/endangered alert activated
- Child was located and recovered safely

Why pursue certification?

- Evidence-based standards
- Enhance critical and specific capacities and competencies
- Ensure updates and improvements to policies
- Provide stakeholders with assurance of high standards in child recovery initiatives
- Allow CART to evolve and continuously improve

- Establish certification team
- Ensure policies, procedures and MOU's are established
- Submit an application for certification with documentation

- Two-day onsite assessment is scheduled
- Day 1- Review policies, procedures and MOUs
- Day 2- Conduct extensive, mock field exercise
- Field report is completed by the assessors
- Report is submitted to AMBER Alert Administrator for consideration


