

#### What is an expert?

#### Federal Rules of Evidence 702

A witness who is qualified as an expert by knowledge, skill, experience, training, or education may testify in the form of an opinion or otherwise if:

(a) the expert's scientific, technical, or other specialized knowledge will help the trier of fact to understand the evidence or to determine a fact in issue;


(b) the testimony is based on sufficient facts or data;

(c) the testimony is the product of reliable principles and methods; and

(d) the expert has reliably applied the principles and methods to the facts of the case

# Why have experts on Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children (CSEC) cases?

- Victim issues:
  - Compliant victims consented
  - Reluctance to disclose
  - Recantations
  - Delayed report
  - Continued delinquent behavior
  - Emotional attachment to abuser
  - Vulnerability of victims



#### **Prosecution issues**

#### O Defendants are

- Unlikely to admit wrong-doing
- Don't want to disrupt their business
- Manipulative
- Psychopathic



#### **Defense strategies**

Consent

Nullification



• Defendant is true hero



## Consent

- Defendant may not be first or latest offender
- •Force, fraud, or coercion might be hard to prove
- •Victim might have engaged in other criminal behavior





## Nullification



- •Jury relates to defendant more than victim
- "Problem child" who can't be cured
- •No one can control victim



## "True Hero"

- "Just" a boyfriend
- Couldn't keep her from doing what she was doing
