Q: From the statistical data in your possession, the percentage of minors involved in crimes against the partner, who are victims of non-direct involvement, how many are there?

A: We are not aware of any statistics that track this information.

Q: What pathologies related to the presence of minors in sexual abuse of partners or violent crimes, have been diagnosed according to the U.S.A. statistics?"

A: We are not aware of any data systematically collected to track this correlation.

Q: The victims of violent crimes, reported at the first aid centers, in what percentage do not submit a complaint, although the reports record the treatments and the type of the same, operated by doctors on duty?

A: We are not aware of any data collection source that specifically tracks this connection.

Q: Do you see an increase in the mental health population committing crimes so that they can receive services while incarcerated?

A: This is an interesting question. We do see people who use the criminal justice system as a way to receive the support, stability and services they need. It becomes important that communities stay aware of this and build resources and accessibility to services so the criminal justice system doesn't have to play this role.

Q: "How do you feel about restorative justice as a way to meet the victim's needs, as well as the root cause of the problem?

A: If the victim is open to this, RJ is a great resource that provides healing, repair and closure. We have a number of initiatives and ask the expert sessions that will further explore this topic.

Q: Do you have resources on the impact of trauma and how to address them?

A: Yes! I would refer you to the numerous webinars we have conducted on this issue.

Q: Thank-you for your time! I just want to confirm this webinar is geared towards adult victims and not under 18, correct?

A: The focus was adults but several aspects apply to both adults and juveniles.
