As we approach the second anniversary of the COVID-19 pandemic, I want to begin by recognizing the extraordinary efforts undertaken by our staff and instructors to overcome the many challenges associated with converting traditional classroom training programs to a range of eLearning formats. Working in close collaboration with one another across 12 training categories funded through 14 unique grants and contract training purpose areas, NCJTC staff members and instructors quickly and effectively pivoted to restructure dozens of training programs and their associated resources into a highly effective online format.

We understand the critical need for training and technical assistance and are proud to report that over the first 20 months of the pandemic, NCJTC delivered 695 online training events to over 105,000 participants.
