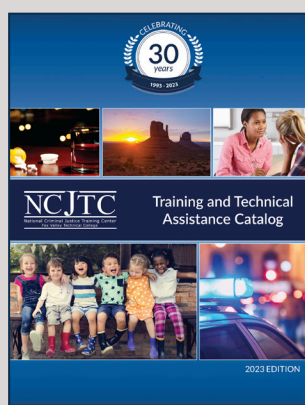

Northeast Wisconsin Safety Concerns Rise With Increase in Courtroom Violence

Court cases can be tense situations, and sometimes those situations can bubble over into violence. Taylor Schabusness, the suspect in a Green Bay murder case, attacked her attorney during a hearing in February. It's a reminder that courthouse safety in Northeast Wisconsin is a top priority. Even though no one was injured in the Green Bay courtroom, experts gathered in Appleton Thursday for the Court Safety and Security Conference for information on how to make courtrooms safer.

This year's Court Safety and Security Conference, March 15-17 in Appleton, WI, brought together nearly 250 court officials from 12 states, several tribal communities and Canada.

Meet The People Who Respond When a Child Goes Missing

Landay, a lieutenant with the Camden County Prosecutor's Office, oversees the agency's Child Abduction Response Team (CART), which recently became just the second group in New Jersey to earn a national certification from the U.S. Dept. of Justice. She and the 225-member CART – whose members come from 37 law enforcement agencies and police departments across Camden County – accepted the recognition after an intensive process that included hours of training and a mock full-scale activation in October under the watchful eye of observers from the National Criminal Justice Training Center of Fox Valley Technical College.

AATTAP Helps Iowa DPS Child Abduction Response Team (CART) Earn U.S. DOJ Certification

The Iowa Department of Public Safety (DPS) Child Abduction Response Team (CART) recently earned national certification from the U.S. Department of Justice for its work to develop, train, and activate a multidisciplinary team equipped to respond to and recover missing children.

The certification event, held February 17, 2023, in Des Moines, was the culmination of the Iowa DPS's work with the AMBER Alert Training and Technical Assistance Program (AATTAP) in partnership with the DOJ and Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP). The Iowa DPS CART was recognized as the 36th certified team in the nation and just the seventh team in the state to obtain such certification.
