### Violence against MMIWG



**84.3%**

More than 4 out of 5  
have experienced violence



**55.5%**

have been physically abused  
by their intimate partners

Indigenous Women have been

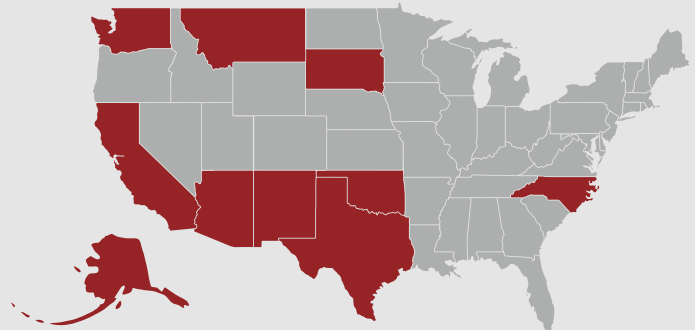
