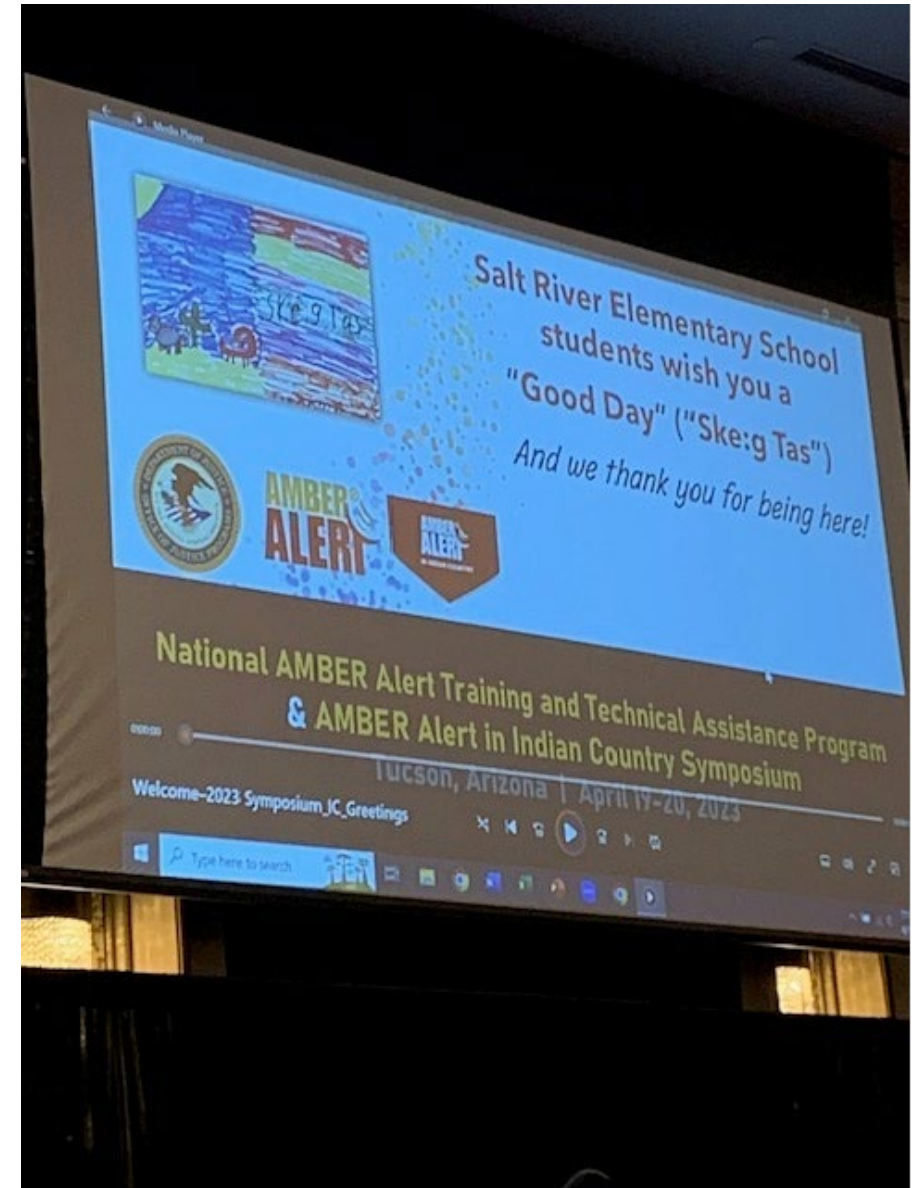

AMBER in Indian Country Technology Toolkits

AiIC Technology Toolkits

- Current funding through US DOJ, OJJDP will provide for up to 265 toolkits.
- An additional \$75,000 has been allocated for specialized equipment for select tribes where the tribe will have the ability to customize the technology resources that are most appropriate for their tribal community to ensure all resources will be utilized as intended.

Print, scan, and copy from nearly anywhere with this portable all-in-one. Easily connect to your printer with Bluetooth Smart Technology.



OLYMPUS TOUGH DIGITAL CAMERA

The digital camera will be used for capturing images for your missing child investigations. A case for the camera is also included.



SANDISK MEMORY CARD 128 GB

The SanDisk 128 GB memory card will be inserted into the Olympus digital camera to store the images and transfer to the computer.



OLYMPUS LI-ION CAMERA BATTERY

The battery powers the digital camera. Keep them charged via the power cable.



6FT HDMI TO HDMI MICRO CABLE

The HDMI cable will connect various items to the Panasonic tablet including the camera and webcam.



PELICAN PROTECTOR CASE

All AiIC Technology Toolkits will come inside a Pelican protector case to ensure it remains secure and protected when not in use.



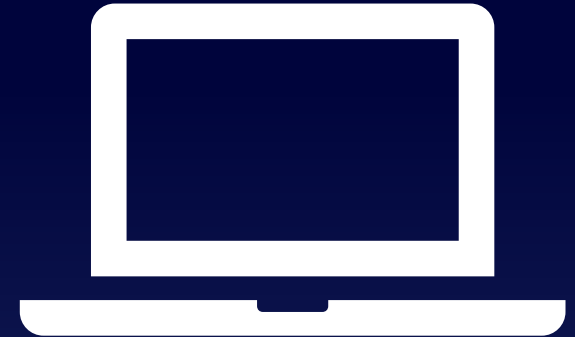
