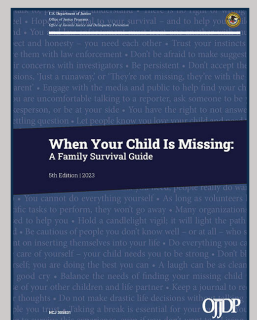


AMBER Advocate Double Issue features:
