Each year on January 13th, we observe National AMBER Alert Awareness Day in remembrance of Amber Hagerman, a 9-year-old girl who was abducted while riding her bike in Arlington, Texas, and brutally murdered. NCJTC's AMBER Alert Training and Technical Assistance Team is committed to honoring her legacy—and that of countless families who have faced the unthinkable—by equipping professionals with the training, resources, and collaboration needed to protect and safely recover missing and abducted children across the nation.

We work with law enforcement, child protection professionals, tribal partners, families and other community members to:

- Enhance response strategies for missing and abducted children.
- Deliver specialized training tailored to tribal and rural communities.
- Provide resources to improve child safety and recovery efforts.
